# "LANSKY" - THE ACCLAIMED OFF-BROADWAY MOB HIT – COMES TO THE AVENTURA ARTS AND CULTURAL CENTER

AVENTURA, Fla. – Mob financier Meyer Lansky rose from his Russian immigrant roots on New York's Lower East Side to a place on *Forbes* list of wealthiest Americans and now, 27 years after his death, he is back in the spotlight in HBO's series *Boardwalk Empire* and in the acclaimed stage production *Lansky* which comes to the Aventura Arts & Cultural Center on Wednesday, January 19 through Sunday, January 30.

Mazel Musicals and Broward Center for the Performing Arts presents Mike Burstyn in the role for which he was nominated for a New York Outer Critics Circle Award as he portrays Lansky's dramatic struggle between a cold-blooded pursuit of the American Dream and a lasting need to honor his Jewish heritage.
