Aventura Arts & Cultural Center Rings In the New Year in January With Broadway, Comedy and Music Stars

AVENTURA, Fla. – The Aventura Arts & Cultural Center gets the New Year off with a bang this January with theatrical fireworks starring some of the biggest names in theater, music and comedy.

The month begins with *Steve Solomon's Cannoli, Latkes, and Guilt: the Therapy Continues...* starring the creator and star of the award-winning show *My Mother's Italian, My Father's Jewish and I'm in Therapy.* This time, Solomon's parents are moving from Brooklyn to their new retirement home in South Florida and between the chaos with his parents, the movers and his dysfunctional but lovable family, the therapy continues. **Performances are Saturday, January 6 at 8 p.m. and Sunday, January 7 at 2 and 7 p.m.** Tickets are \$45–\$49.

The voice of Hans in Disney's *Frozen*, he has also appeared on Broadway in *The Importance of Being Earnest, Brighton Beach Memoirs* and *Billy Elliot*. Jessica Fontana has starred on Broadway in the title role of Rodgers & Hammerstein's *Cinderella* as well as *Baby It's You* and *Pipe Dream* and is familiar to South Florida audiences for her local performances in *The Most Happy Fella* and *110 in the Shade*.
